

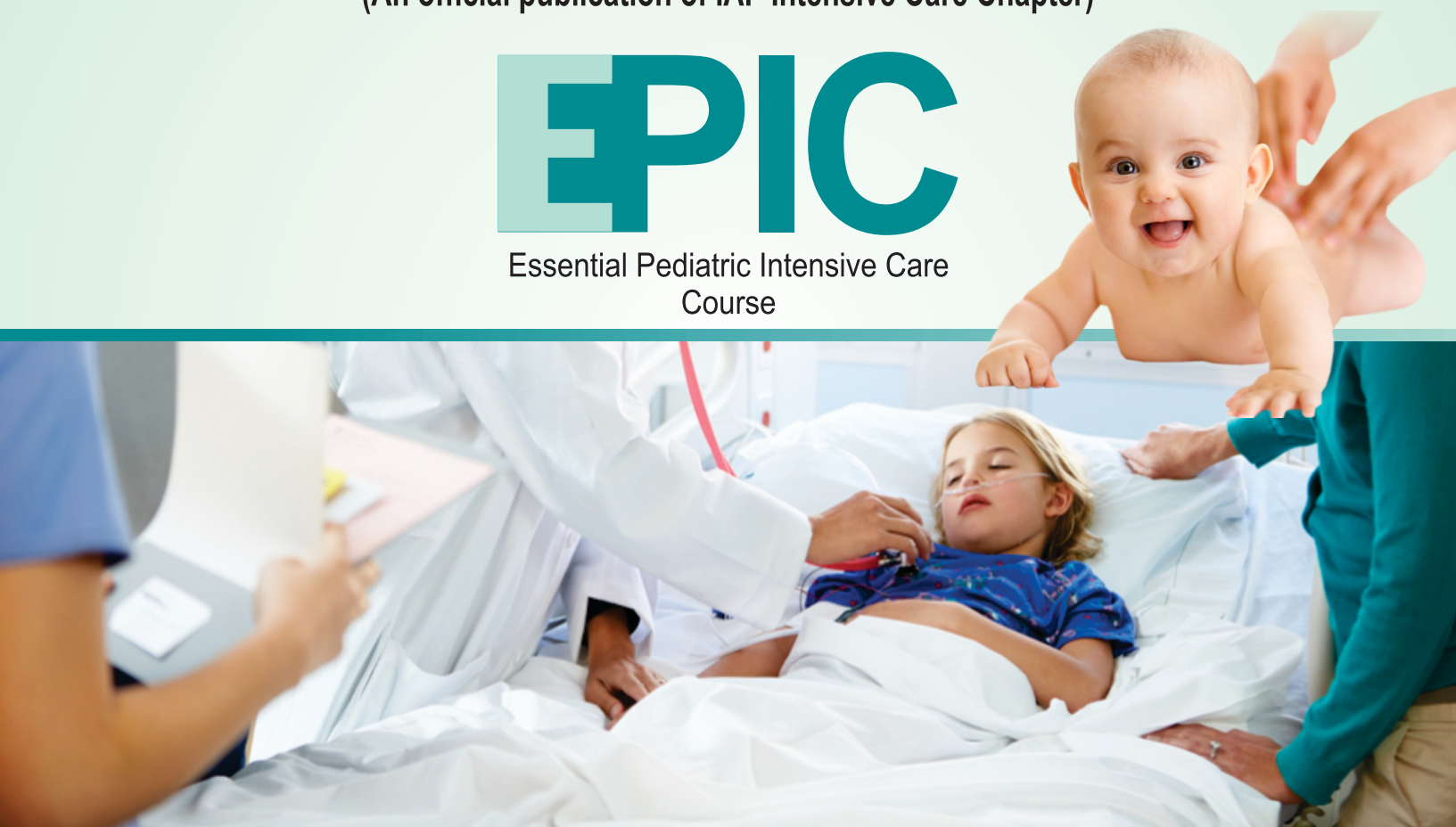


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

The whole team of experts and Intensive Care chapter have worked hard over the last year and have gone through several pilot courses starting from first course in Patna in April, before finalising the course contents and training methods.
